of Health will be holding a public meeting on Wednesday February 28, at 7:00 pm at the Health Department at 1033 Health Care Drive, Charlotte, to repeal the regulation, that was approved by the County Board of Commissioners in Barry & Eaton County, to have on-site sewage and water supplies evaluated before the sale of a home. The responsibility of the onsite inspections will be at the discretion of the buyer and seller of the home. The Board of Health will take action on this issue immediately after the public meeting that same night.

Checking for contamination in the ground from the solar equipment and its installation. Another resident is concerned for

the safety our fireman if they are called to an issue at a solar site. He identified that solar panel's electrical power output cannot be turned off (Stopped), as long as the panel is exposed to sunlight or any another light source.
