Stormwater Pollution Prevention Initiative Due to MDNRE July 1

The Stormwater Pollution Prevention Initiative (SWPPI) will need to be submitted to the MDNRE by July 1, 2010. As part of the SWPPI permittees need to submit their updated Illicit Discharge Elimination Plan, Public Education Plan and Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) for storage yards and facilities and an optional alternative approach.

If you will be using an alternative approach to meet any permit requirements it must be submitted to the MDNRE with your SWPPI – this requires pre-approval from the Department.
